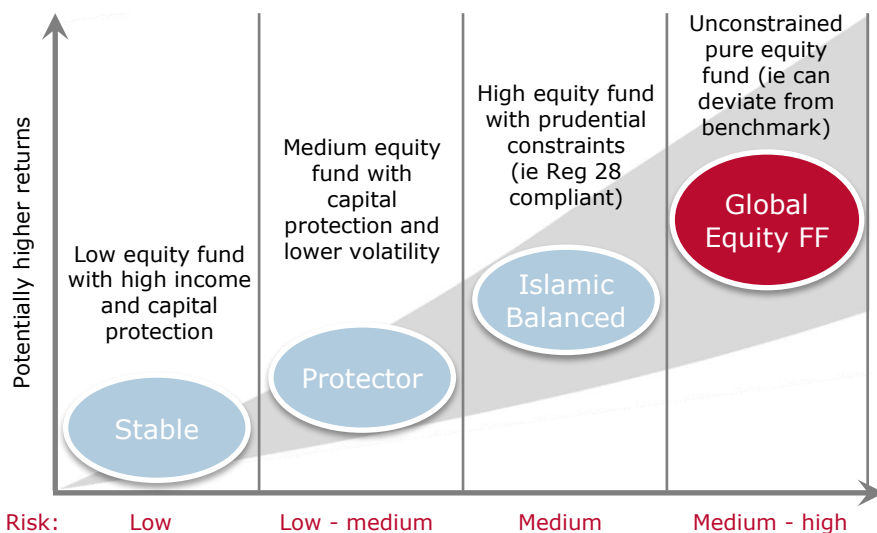

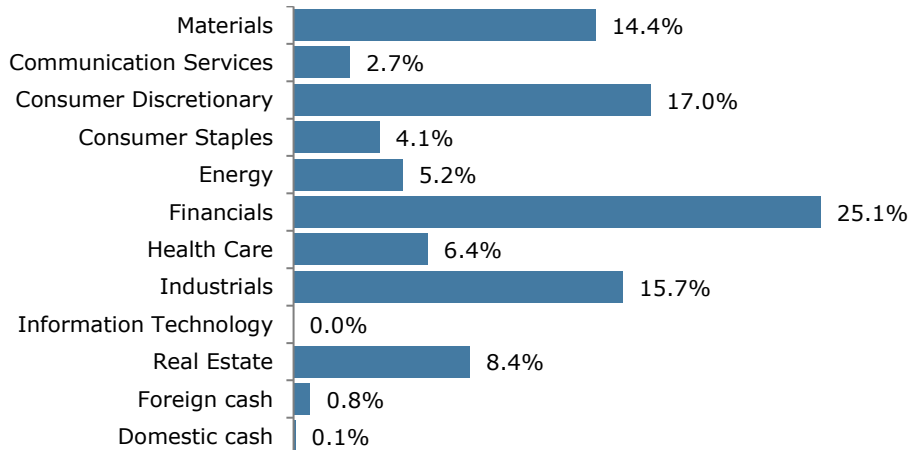

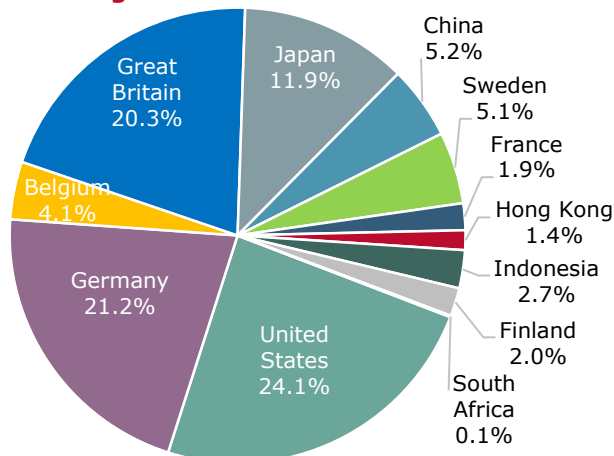
Asset and sector allocation
