
Kagiso Stable Fund February 2020

This fund is Regulation 28 compliant and can invest in a wide variety of domestic and international asset classes (such as equities, listed property, conventional bonds, inflation-linked bonds and cash). The fund is positioned in our team's best ideas - which emanate from our bottom-up research process - and is actively managed to maximise long-term returns without assuming excess risk of loss.



This is calculated by taking the difference between the Fund's annualised return and the riskfree (cash) rate, divided by the standard deviation of the Fund's returns.

¹ Performance is quoted from Morningstar as at month-end for a lump sum investment using Class A Net Asset Value (NAV) prices with income distributions reinvested (income is reinvested on the reinvestment date). NAV refers to the value of the fund's assets less the value of its liabilities, divided by the number of units in issue. Performance figures are quoted after the deduction of all costs incurred within the fund. Individual investor performance may differ as a result of initial fees, the actual investment date, the date of reinvestment and dividend withholding tax.
